The judging weekend will be held on 25 & 26 August, and winners will be announced at the Awards Evening on Sunday 16 September.

### Olives WA Shopfront at the Perth Royal Show

Our friends at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA have offered us a shopfront at the Taste WA Marketplace during the 8 days of the Royal Show ie from Sat 22 September to Sunday 30 September.

The Market place is a row of farmers' market-style marquee booths situated in the outside area of Taste WA and will feature café umbrellas, high bar tables and seating. This is a great opportunity for medal winners to market and sell their produce for a day. The initiative has been designed by RASWA to offer an additional benefit for competition entrants, and further increase promotional opportunities to the winners. It is recommended stalls have

some sort of sample for the public to try, as this has proven to dramatically increase interaction and sales to the stallholders.

RASWA may also have some stage demonstration slots available if people would like to demonstrate how to use their product eg cooking demonstration. These are subject to availability.

Medal winners from the 2018 Perth Royal Olive Awards will be eligible to become exhibitors for a day (or potentially half a day if there is a lot of interest). After the judging weekend (25&26 August) we will send medal winners more information on the marketplace and seek their interest in getting involved.

# IPDM Field Days -15 & 17 February 2019

Dates for your diaries - Two Integrated Pest and Disease Management field days are to be held in February 2019 (exact locations to be advised). The field days will be delivered via a partnership program run by the Australian Olive Association, the Western Sydney University and Hort Innovation.

The program will give olive growers access to current, practical information and instruction for implementing integrated pest and disease management (IPDM) strategies, focussing on the sustainable management of three major pests and diseases for the industry: black scale, olive lace bug and anthracnose.
